GOKYU (5TH)

Shomenuchi ikkyo*, Munetski kotagaeshi*, Ushiro ryotedori kokyunage*, Katatedori shihonage*, Shomenuchi iriminage*, Suwariwaza Kokyudosa*

> Sensei may ask you to perform extra techniques that he is sure you will know (at his option).

YONKYU (4TH)

Fundamental arts include all marked (*) plus Shomenuchi nikyo & three variations of any two techniques

ELECTIVE ARTS: Yokomenuchi iriminage, Katadori Ikkyo - nikyo

NOTES

Each art is to be done on both the right and left sides. You must be at least 15 years of age to take a Shihan test, and at least 22 years of age to take the Yondan test.

Plan on testing about every other test period. The Sensei's will review all student records before each test and make determinations as to who will test.

SANKYU (3RD)

Fundamental arts include Gokyu and Yonkyu techniques plus Shomenuchi sankyo -yonkyo (tachiwaza - suwariwaza), Katadori sankyo -yonkyo (tachiwaza suriwaza) & five variations of any two techniques

ELECTIVE ARTS: Yokomenuchi ikkyo nikyo, Shomenuchi kotagaeshi, Any five techniques done zagi

> At this level you may choose to do additional techniques if you wish. Please check with Sensei.

NIKYU (2ND)

Fundamental arts will include Gokyu, Yonkyu & Sankyu techniques plus Hanmi handachi jiyuwaza, Katatedori iriminage, Futarigake as well as three variations of any two techniques

ELECTIVE ARTS: Katatedori kaitennage Ryotedori tenchinage Katatedori ryotemochi (iriminage and kotagaeshi)

At this level, all arts are done in a flowing style. You must also begin to practice on your knees.

IKKYU (1ST)

All Gokyu, Yonkyu, Sankyu and Nikyu techniques are done. Additional arts are: Suwariwaza Ryotedori shihonage, Ryotedori iriminage, Ryotedori iriminage (juji), Ryotedori kohonage (ushironage) and, five variations of any two techniques, Tannininzugake (Three man attack)

ELECTIVE ARTS: Any six techniques (student's choice) standing or seated.

SHODAN

FUNDAMENTAL ARTS: Ikkyu test PLUS: Jiyuwaza Tantodori - arts ELECTIVE ARTS: Yokomenuchi -5 arts Ushirowaza -5 arts Yonningake

60 days of practice after obtaining lkkyu

NIDAN

FUNDAMENTAL ARTS: Tachidori -5 arts Jiyuwaza ELECTIVE ARTS: Munetski -3 arts Shomenuchi -5 arts Goningake

1 year of practice after obtaining Shodan

SANDAN

FUNDAMENTAL ARTS: Jiyuwaza ELECTIVE ARTS: NONE

2 years of practice after obtaining Nidan

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Testing is held every three (3) months. As a rule, adult students are tested every other time.

The Chief Instructor will determine which individuals are eligible based on set guidelines and criteria.
